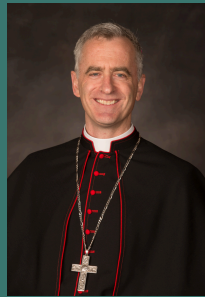

Programs and Services

☪ SUPPORTIVE SERVICES FOR VETERAN FAMILIES (SSVF)

We support veterans and their families at risk of homelessness or housing instability by providing financial assistance (e.g., rent, utilities, security deposits), and connecting veterans with community resources and VA Medical Centers to achieve and maintain stable housing. SSVF grant funded by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

☪ SUPPORTIVE ASSISTANCE FOR INDIVIDUALS & FAMILIES (SAIF)



This program creates a safety net for families and individuals approaching their time limits on public assistance in Burlington, Camden and Gloucester Counties. Through Intensive Case Management, we address barriers to employment or establish links to alternate income sources when the client is unable to work. SAIF grant funded by the State of New Jersey Department of Human Services, Division of Family Development.

☪ IMMIGRATION, REFUGEE, AND MIGRANTS SERVICES

We have a long history of supporting refugees, asylees, and immigrants as they build new lives in the U.S. By partnering with local agencies, we help clients achieve self-sufficiency, access resources, navigate legal requirements, and integrate into the community—promoting awareness, protection, and inclusion.

☪ ADDICTIONS HEALING SERVICES

Many families in our Diocese are impacted by addictions. We provide compassionate and spiritual support, evidence-based educational services, and community resources for individuals, families, and older adults. We are a presence and guide for parish communities through our monthly newsletter, Recovery Stations of the Cross, educational programs, retreats, and referrals to community resources.

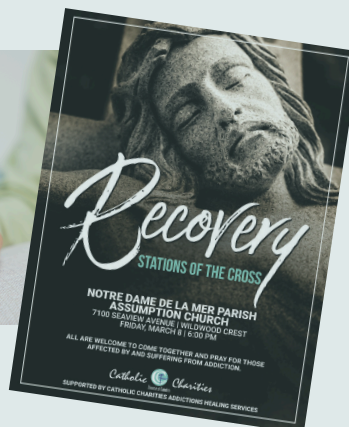
☪ PRISON MINISTRY

We deliver pastoral and sacramental care to those who are incarcerated, assist parishes in ministering to them and their families, and work to uphold their rights through advocacy.

☪ ADOPTION SERVICES

From 1936 to the early 2000s, Catholic Charities of South Jersey facilitated thousands of adoptions. Today, many adoptees seek information about their early lives and birth parents. When mutually desired, we help facilitate reconnections.

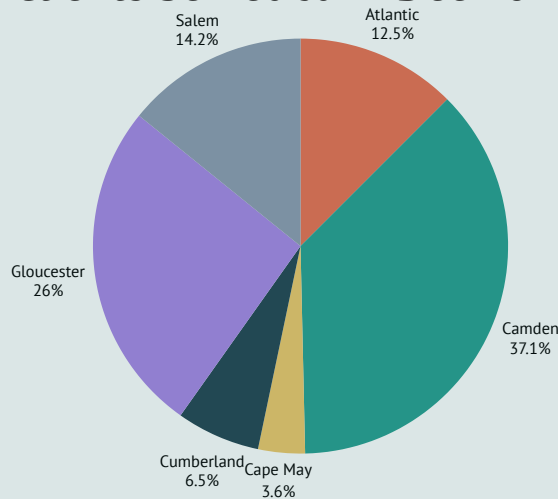
🌐 FAMILY & COMMUNITY CENTERS

Catholic Charities of South Jersey operates six Family and Community Centers, one in each county of the Diocese of Camden. Each center addresses local needs and connects clients to other programs and partners. Services may include food pantries, diaper distribution, and temporary financial assistance for eligible clients.
